Embark on a unique journey through Chilean Patagonia

The Kayak Tyndall expedition offers an **immersive** experience in the region's purest nature.



Over the course of four days, you'll paddle along the **Tyndall River**, tracing its waters all the way to the glacier of the same name—one of the most remote and **majestic formations in the Southern Patagonian Ice Field**. With its imposing face over **Lake Geike**, it is the largest glacier found on the edge of Torres del Paine National Park.

Along the route, you'll venture into **untouched landscapes of coigüe and cypress forests, surrounded by snow-covered mountains and hanging glaciers**. The journey ends at the **Serrano River**, where turquoise waters blend with the deep blue of **Lake Grey**, offering panoramic views of Bernardo O'Higgins National Park.

# ITINERARY

## DAY 1

- Arrival in Puerto Natales, transfer from Airport to accommodation.
- Welcome cocktail and briefing.

## DAY 2

- Transfer from accommodation to Torres del Paine Park, Lake Grey Sector.
- Kayak route from Lake Grey to Villa Serrano. Duration 4 to 5 hours, distance 30 km.
- Dinner and accommodation at Camping Serrano sector.

## DAY 3

- Breakfast at Camping Serrano to travel to Tyndall Glacier, duration 5 to 6 hours, distance 23 km.
- Dinner and accommodation at improvised camping in Tyndall Lake sector.

## DAY 4


- Breakfast in Tyndall to travel to Camping Balmaceda, duration 6 to 7 hours, distance 40 km.
- Dinner and accommodation at Camping Balmaceda.

## DAY 5

- Breakfast at Camping Balmaceda, tour around Serrano Glacier for 2 hours.
- Return to Camping Balmaceda to take a Catamaran to Estancia Perales where we will be welcomed with a traditional Lamb Roast lunch.
- Return by Catamaran to Puerto Bories, then return to Natales by private transport, arriving at accommodation at 6:00 PM.
- Accommodation and dinner in Puerto Natales.

## DAY 6

- Transfer from accommodation to the Airport.
- End of services.



# RECOMMENDATIONS

## When to Visit?

Torres del Paine National Park is accessible year-round, although the recommended season is between October and April, which coincides with spring and summer in the Southern Hemisphere. During these months, days are longer, temperatures average around 15°C / 59°F, and rainfall is less frequent.
